New Coal Mine in Bryn

Rhys Jeffreys of 5 Caxton Rd., Neath has applied for planning permission for a coal mine at Penhyddwaelod Farm at the edge of Bryn. Details of this proposal can be found on the NPT website under planning number P2015/1058. This application also references P2012/0799 which has already been approved. The proposal is for an initial years production of about 1,000 tonnes while clearing an old air vent prior to establishing full production as long term mine.

It is with regret that this year's Beast of Bryn trail running races will not be taking place.

Following recent announcements by Tata Steel, the organising committee, in partnership with Strip Products UK, have reached a decision not to hold this year's event. The decision to cancel the event has not been taken lightly; discussions led to a collective decision that holding the event following such difficult times was not appropriate.

Shaun Tobin, a race director, said "It is extremely sad that this year's event will not be taking place. As a steelworker, I completely understand the difficulties being faced by the business and at this time holding the event feels inappropriate. I am hopeful that this time next year we will be in a different position and the Beast can be



picked up from its resting place."

If you are one of the athletes that has already entered the race we apologise for any inconvenience caused and all entry fees and costs incurred will be completely refunded.

The very successful Beast of Bryn race has grown year on year attracting runners and

spectators from far afield and raising more than £60K for charity. Organisers share a very personal link to the race and have worked tirelessly during the last five years to provide a community event as well as donating the funds raised to charities close to their hearts.

On behalf of the organizing committee we would like to thank you for supporting and making what we think is a great and unique event. We have strived with a lot of passion, fun and hard work to create an unforgettable experience for the athlete, supporter and spectator included.

This event would not have been such a great success without the totally voluntary support from numerous people and businesses far too many to mention, no matter how little or large that support has been, we really appreciate it.


Brvn IT Club


Richard Burton 10k
